




AAPIs are the fastest growing minority group in the US...




AAPI Population Density of 60+ (2006)

Between 2010 and 2030, the AAPI older adult population is projected to increase by 145%...




Limited English Proficiency (LEP)

- Individuals who do not speak English as their primary language and who have a limited ability to read, write, speak or understand English, may be limited English proficient.
- LEP is also defined as a person's selfassessed ability to speak English less than "Very Well".



LEP Rates Among Ethnic Groups





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In 2010, only 15% of **AAPI older** adults spoke **English** at home...





More than 2 out of every 3

Chinese, Korean, Vietnamese, Laotian, Hmong, Fijian, Marshallese, Nepalese, Taiwanese, Bangladeshi, and Burmese older adults **are LEP**



28% of AAPI older adults live in poverty



More than 1 out of 5

Korean, Bangladeshi, Burmese, Cambodian, Micronesian, and Nepalese older adults **are impoverished**



More than 2 out of 3

Chinese, Filipino, Korean, Vietnamese, Asian Indian, Bangladeshi, Burmese, Indonesian, Nepalese, Pakistani, Taiwanese, and Thai older adults

The Emerging Needs of AAPI Older Adults: What We Know and What We Have Learned

Full Report



Key Findings:

- 1. The needs of AAPIs are often ignored or are invisible, leading to inequitable access to services.
- 2. AAPI older adults suffer from racial discrimination because of citizenship requirements and limited English proficiency that are not present for other diverse groups.
- Aggregated data collection on AAPI older adults has led to wide-spread generalizations, thereby rendering the specific needs and characteristics of subgroups invisible.

 We must fight against discrimination and unfair disparity in services by providing all limited English proficient AAPI older adults with equitable access to in-language services.

Recommendation 2 (Continued)

- Language Access Plan
 - Use of interpreters for intakes and assessments.
 - Translation of vital correspondence
- Contracts with Sub-Grantees/Providers
 - Language Access is part of the Scope of Work and Administrative Standards
 - Language Access is part of the Evaluation Criteria for Award
 - All Offerors must submit a Language Access Plan with Proposal



- Partner with AAPI-serving communitybased organizations.
 - Self-assessment for organizations

Seven Best Practices When Conducting a Community Needs Assessment with Asian American and Pacific Islander (AAPI) Older Adults

Purpose: To adopt a culturally and linguistically appropriate approach to assess the needs of AAPI older adults, so an organization can take action, set priorities, allocate resources, and ensure equitable access to appropriate services.

RECT DRACTICE 1: Form on AADI Advisory Committee



- Develop disaggregated ethnic and language data collection and reporting policies. Disaggregated data will bring visibility to all diverse populations and inform planning, evaluation and resource allocations.
 - Identify AAPI population counts
 - AAPI Data OAA
 - Diverse Elders Coalition
 - <u>Recommended OMB Standards</u>



- Speak as a unified voice for AAPI older adults nationwide.
 - Affiliate Network
