All land within the limits of any Indian reservation under the jurisdiction of the US Government...


Land that is located within the exterior boundaries of an Indian reservation is Indian Country.

18 U.S. Code § 1151





Title VI of the Older Americans Act


ACL funds programs that support American Indians, Alaska Natives and Native Americans in the areas of:

Title VI by the Numbers*

- Transportation Services: Provided over 800,000 rides
- Home-Delivered Nutrition Services: Provided more than 2.6 million meals to more than 43,000 elders
- Congregate Nutrition Services: Provided more than
 2.4 million meals to nearly 61,000 elders



Title VI by the Numbers, cont.

- Information, Referral, and Outreach Services: Provided more than 845,000 hours of service
- In-Home Services: Provided over 1.26 million units of service
- Caregiver Counseling and Support Group Services: Provided more than 34,000 units of service
- Caregiver Respite Services: Provided more than 80,000 units service

Conducting Research in Indian Country

- Respect and accurately reflect the varied cultures and traditions among Native Americans
- Culturally appropriate research methods
- Address and highlight the diversity across tribal communities
- Build and maintain a trust between tribal communities and researchers

Community Participatory Evaluation

"Participatory evaluation is a partnership approach to evaluation in which stakeholders actively engage in developing the evaluation and ALL phases of its implementation." (Zukaski, A., & Luluquisen, M., 2002)





Title VI Logic Model




